## **Uniform Policy**

## Aims and Objectives

It is our policy that all children should wear school uniform when attending our school, on the basis that:

- it promotes a sense of pride in our school;
- it engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
- it is practical and smart;
- it identifies children with the school;
- it is not distracting in class (as fashion clothing might be);
- it makes the children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- it is regarded as suitable and good value for money;
- it has been designed with health, safety and comfort in mind

### WINTER:

Blue shirt, blouse, or pale blue polo shirt, grey trousers or skirt and maroon cardigan or sweatshirt. black flat shoes



### SUMMER:

As above but alternatively short grey trousers or light blue dress in plain striped or checked material.



We also offer a fleece jacket and a reversible rain jacket.

Please ensure that items of clothing, especially coats, hats, wellingtons etc. are clearly marked with your child's name.

Children will require the following items of clothing for physical education lessons **white t-shirt, navy blue shorts or blue or black jogging bottoms, black gym shoes with elasticated fronts or plain black trainers.**



It is also helpful if children have a small bag in which to keep their items of PE equipment, all of which should be clearly marked with your child's name. Older junior children will also find it useful to have a tracksuit and a pair of trainers. For reasons of safety and to guard against loss, children are **NOT ALLOWED** to wear any jewellery.

**Hair:**

Long hair should be tied or pinned back so that it does not cover the face or desk.

**Uniform Providers:**

**Pre-worn uniform:**

As a school we try to be as sustainable as possible, and recognise that children can grow out of uniform quickly. This can be costly for families and also affect the environment if it goes into landfill. We therefore collect pre-worn uniform that is in good condition, and make it available for families to access throughout the school year as needed. Enquiries about available stock can be made via the school office.

In specific circumstances, for example reasons of faith or culture, it may be difficult for some pupils to fully comply with the uniform policy. Parents should discuss this with the Head teacher if appropriate.

**Parents:**

We ask for the cooperation of parents to support the school with adhering to the uniform policy. If any family is experiencing difficulty providing the required uniform they should contact the Headteacher or Family Support Worker to discuss this.

**Governors:**

The LGC supports the Headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding this policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity.

It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all national regulations concerning equal opportunities and that our school uniform policy is consistent with our policy on equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school uniform policy helps children to dress sensibly and suitably, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

**Monitoring and Review:**

When monitoring the policy the governors will:

- consider with the Headteacher any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensations;
- require the Headteacher to report to the governors on the way the policy is being implemented.
